



Flagler Playhouse Apprenticeship Program

The Flagler Playhouse Apprenticeship Program gives a select group of young people a chance to learn theater techniques in a hands-on professional setting. Though the work may be challenging, it is a real world example of what these young people will actually experience as adult artists. The hours worked will count as volunteer/community service. Applicants should be prepared to train in any and all areas, though each apprentice will have a concentration in a specific field.

SETS AND SCENERY- Learn how a set goes from concept to stage: Design, construction, and painting. You will learn how to work with the Director of the show, bringing their concept to reality. Understand how the sets and scenery are crucial to a production and yet need to be easily accessible.

PROPERTIES- Learn about the selection and acquisition of stage props and their organization during a show. You will be vital in the process of photographing and cataloguing existing props from previous shows.

COSTUMES- Learn how costumes are chosen, constructed, and altered by working with our Costume Coordinator. Learn how costumes are maintained, cleaned, and stored during a show. Learn how the costumes, wigs, and personal props enhance a character.

STAGE MANAGEMENT- Learn how the actors on stage depend on the crew backstage by assisting with lighting, set changes, blocking notes, and following cue sheets. Learn how a Stage Manager assists the Director.

FACILITIES MANAGEMENT- Learn how “all the little things matter” by helping in the maintenance of the theater building and grounds, assisting with House Management, ushering, box office, refreshments, parking, and ensuring all audience members are satisfied.

DIRECTION- Learn the ins and outs of directing a show. From casting the actors, rehearsal, and performance, you will assist the Director of one of our shows this season.

WORKSHOP ASSISTANT- Assist our Theater Education Coordinator during our Saturday Acting Workshops for children and young adults. You will be able to observe how an acting workshop is run. The Workshop Assistant will also help with the children's musical theater summer camp.

*Apprenticeships will take place during the run of one show, usually 6-8 weeks. There will be a minimum of 15 hours per week assigned to each Apprentice. Specific days/hours/times will be discussed and agreed upon between yourself and the person your Apprenticeship will be under. A combination of various volunteer experiences can be arranged.

*At the end of the Apprenticeship period, a \$500 scholarship will be awarded to one exceptional Apprentice. This award will be based on attendance, enthusiasm, fulfillment of tasks, and general attitude, as well as successful completion of the final project.
